






Mounting Drawings



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Step 1:

The Crash Bar is supplied in two halves.


The drawings shown here, illustrates the Assembly of the Right Hand Half of the Crash Bar.

Orient the Crash Bar and align it with the bottom side mounting hole in the Motorbike (as shown in Red colour).

Slip-in the Flange Bush (2) – 1 off, Screw M8 x 45 (6) – 1 off and Washer M8 (10) -1 off, as shown and secure the threads, but not tighten it fully.

Step 2:

Slip-in Screw M8 x 55 (8) – 1 off and Flange Bush (2) – 1 off and Washer M8 (10) -1 off, as shown, and secure the threads in the Mounting hole (as shown in Red colour), but not tighten it fully.







Step 3:

This covers the Mounting to the Third spot as shown.

Slip-in Flange Bush (2) - 1 off, Screw M8 x 45 (7) - 1 off and Washer M8 (10) - 1 off, as shown, and secure the threads in the Mounting hole (as shown in Red Colour), but not tighten it fully.






As Is Mounted Condition of Crash Bar (Right Hand Half) is shown in the drawing.



Step 4:

Mounting of Joint Pipe (4) on Top and Bottom side of the Crash Bar.

Slip-in the Joint Pipe (4) - 2 off, 1 each on Top side and Bottom side and slide-in M6 x 16 Cap Screw (5) and Washer M6 (9) - 2 off, as shown, and secure the threads.



Step 5:


Mounting of Crash Bar Left Hand half.

Orient the Crash Bar and align it with the bottom side mounting hole in the Motorbike (as shown in Red colour).


Slip-in the Flange Bush (2) – 1 off, Screw M8 x 45 (6) – 1 off and Washer M8 (10) -1 off, as shown and secure the

Step 6:

Slip-in Screw M8 x 55 (8) – 1 off and Flange Bush (2) – 1 off and Washer M8 (10) -1 off, as shown, and secure the threads in the Mounting hole (as shown in Red colour), but not tighten it fully.



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
Step 7:


This covers the Mounting to the Third spot as shown.

Slip-in Flange Bush (2) - 1 off, Screw M8 x 45 (7) - 1 off and Washer M8 (10) - 1 off, as shown, and secure the threads in the Mounting hole (as shown in Red Colour), but not tighten it fully.

Step 8:

Orient the Crash Bar (Left Hand Half), to the Joint Pipe (fitted already to the Right Hand Half) and slide-in M6 x 16 Cap Screw (5) and Washer M6 (9) – 2 off, as shown, and secure the threads.






As Is Mounted Condition of the Crash Bar, is as shown in the drawing

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Step 9:

Assemble the Slider Bar on each of the Crash Bar as shown.

Use the Slider Bar as the Virtual
Orientation and looking from the
front side of the Motorbike, make
one final Positioning and Alignment
of the Crash bars.

Ensure mounting symmetry of the Slider Bars visually (it must not be offset or shifted visually when seen from the front side and back side).

Step 10:

All Screws can be fully tightened to the torque, as specified in the BOM table.

The installation is completed with this step.



General Information

- 7. If any additional modifications are to be done, prior to the fitment of the accessories, it will be explicitly specified in the instruction sheets.
